Annual mass weighing and height taking for all preschool children ages 0-59 mos old. Indices used: Weight-For-Age, Length/Height-For-Age and Weight-For-Length/Height

The NNC Governing Board issued a Memorandum Circular dated 10 May 2017 stating the full implementation of NNC GB Resolution No. 4 S2012.

We target at least 80% of all 0-59 months old children in all LGUs

### **Implications and Recommendations**

- Direct efforts to address chronic malnutrition or stunting as it affects 72,179 children.
- With the significant increase of overweight (from 2.7% to 3.1%), actions have to be put in place to arrest the situation.
- Prioritize areas with high prevalence in almost all indicators: Cities of Guihulngan (4\*), Canlaon (3\*), Carcar (3\*), Bais (3\*), Bayawan (2\*), Toledo (2\*) and Cebu (2\*)

Global network of Academe Organization

Established to catalyze academia and the research community to support the renewed efforts of the SUN Movement to eliminate all forms of malnutrition as aligned with the goals of the Philippine Plan of Action for Nutrition (PPAN).

# CSA Chair (CORE GROUP)

#### **Expectations**

- Voluntary and does not have a salary.
- Constituted by the Council of Deans and Heads of Nutrition and Dietetics (CODHEND), the Nutritionist-Dietitians' Association of the Philippines (NDAP) and its National Dietetic and Academe Practice Group (DPG), and the BIDANI (Barangay Integrated Development Approach for Nutrition Improvement) Network Program of State Universities and Colleges (SUCs).



#### **Roles and Responsibilities**

- Advise the Steering Group on key strategic interventions for purposes of supporting national CSA's.
- 2. Assure that there is consistency in the SUN CSN mission, vision, programs and service delivery.
- 3. Provide effective leadership and convene meetings for the SUN CSN Steering Group that builds positive and lasting civil society engagement at particularly subnational, national, regional and international supporting the objectives of the SUN movement.





# **Business Chair (CO-CONVENERS)**

#### **Expectations**

- Voluntary and does not have a salary.
- The SBN is convened by by the Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition (GAIN) and the United Nations World Food Programme (WFP). GAIN and WFP Country Representatives serve on this Committee; the SBN Coordinator is Secretary to the Committee.



#### **Roles and Responsibilities**

1. Overall accountability for the SBN's implementation and performance.

2. Provide strategic guidance on matters related to SBN and its operations, including ensuring all funding proposals are in line with agreed-upon SBN priorities.

3. Approve the Advisory Committee messages to the Network Champion.





# **Civil Society Association Chair**

#### **Expectations**

- Voluntary and does not have a salary.
- Should have endorsed the SUN framework and be carrying out an active agenda to scale up nutrition efforts nationally and / or globally.
- The chairperson's organization will, as institutional engagement in the SUN movement, budget and cover costs for chairperson's role including travel to key events and meetings to represent the SUN CSN as well as the SUN global gathering and annual meeting of the SUN CSN.



#### **Roles and Responsibilities**

- 1. Advise the Steering Group on key strategic interventions for purposes of supporting national CSA's.
- 2. Assure that there is consistency in the SUN CSN mission, vision, programs and service delivery.
- 3. Provide effective leadership and convene meetings for the SUN CSN Steering Group that builds positive and lasting civil society engagement at particularly subnational, national, regional and international supporting the objectives of the SUN movement.





# **Academe Steering Group Members**

#### **Expectations**

- Voluntary and does not have a salary.
- Members can be Deans, Heads, and Educators from various Institutional Member Schools offering Nutrition and Dietetics (professors/educators of Nutrition and Dietetic courses); Nutrition and Dietetic professional groups; SUCs with extension programs focusing on nutrition-indevelopment.

#### **Roles and Responsibilities**

1. Attend and participate in all meetings of the network, including of the working groups as appropriate.

2. Provide suggested agenda items to the Chairperson at least three weeks before the meeting.

3. Each member SUC will submit annual accomplishment report.

## Business Steering Group Members (Advisory Committee)



#### **Expectations**

- Voluntary and does not have a salary.
- Shall be drawn from a range of stakeholders involved in the scaling up of nutrition in the country, i.e., the private sector, civil society, and the public sector. The majority members will be representatives of the private sector.
- Individual/company commitment to success of the SBN and nutrition more broadly should also be considered to ensure full participation.

#### **Roles and Responsibilities**

- 1. Advocate for business engagement in scaling-up nutrition.
- 2. Identify new opportunities for business contributions to nutrition.
- 3. Support in the recruitment of the new members to the Network.
- 4. Advocate for resource mobilization for SBN operations, if appropriate.







# **Civil Society Association Steering Group Members**

#### **Expectations**

- Voluntary and does not have a salary.
- Endorsed the SUN framework and be carrying out an active agenda to scale up nutrition efforts sub-nationally, nationally and / or globally.
- The Steering Group member's organization will, as institutional engagement in the SUN movement, budget and cover costs for Steering Group member's role including travel to key events and meetings to represent the SUN CSN as well as the SUN global gathering and annual meeting of the SUN CSN.

#### **Roles and Responsibilities**

- Support National and Sub-national SUN CSA according to steering group member's skills, expertise and current portfolio, in close collaboration with SUN CSN secretariat team and in line with country support framework.
- 2. Determine the mission, goal, vision and strategic objectives of the SUN CSN.
- 3. Proactive participation in the development, monitoring and delivery of a strategic plan of action for the SUN CSN that will build positive and lasting civil society engagement at international, regional and particularly national and sub-national level.
