**SUPPORTING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PHILIPPINE
MULTI-SECTORAL NUTRITION PROJECT (PMNP) OR THE
KASAPATAN AT UGNAYAN NG MAMAMAYAN SA AKMANG PAGKAIN
AT NUTRISYON IN THE BICOL REGION**

Whereas, the Bicol Regional Development Council received a request from the Inter-Agency Task Force on Zero Hunger to support the implementation of the Philippine Multi-Sectoral Nutrition Project (PMNP) or the *Kasapatan at Ugnayan ng Mamamayan sa Akmang Pagkain at Nutrisyon*;

Whereas, the PMNP, a project designed to address the perennial problem of malnutrition, aims to increase the utilization of a package composed of nutrition-specific and nutrition-sensitive interventions across various local government platforms; and improve key social behaviors and practices known to reduce stunting in targeted local government units;

Whereas, the project will contribute to the attainment of the sector outcomes of the Bicol Regional Development Plan 2017 to 2022 on accelerating human capital development by providing health and nutrition for all;

Whereas, the PMNP supports the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 2: Zero Hunger, and SDG 3: Good Health and Well-Being; and

Whereas, the Bicol Social Development Committee (SDC), during its meeting on May 7, 2021, endorsed to the RDC the proposal for support to the implementation of the PMNP.

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of the SDC Chairperson, Mayor Cielo Krisel Lagman-Luistro of Tabaco City, unanimously seconded, **BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED**, to support the implementation of the PMNP in Bicol Region.
