### Philippine food security index score: 5.05/10

### PHILIPPINES MOST FOOD INSECURE IN EAST AND SOUTHEAST ASIA

The Philippines placed 146<sup>th</sup> out of 171 countries in the Global Food Security Index Q2 2022 developed by consultancy agency Deep Knowledge Analytics. The index was constructed from 40 food security indicators divided into three main dimensions: food accessibility; crisis level; and food system and economy resilience. With an overall food security index score of 5.05 out of the possible 10, the Philippines ranked last among its peers in the East and Southeast Asia.

NOTES: - The index identifies countries at risk for humanitarian emergencies and disasters that could overwhelm current national response capacity and therefore lead to a need for international assistance. It covers three main dimensions: Access to Food - measures ease of access to sufficient and nutritious food that meets people's dietary needs for a bealthy and active life.

Crisis Level - assesses a country's exposure to the impacts of a changing climate, sociological or biological hazards.

Food System and Economy Resilience - evaluates resources available that can alleviate the impact of global food crisis.

 According to the report, the global food system has been destabilized by the recent Russian invasion of Ukraine, and levels of hunger and existing acute food insecurity are expected to increase even further by the end of 2022.

- The report is based on data collected until July 1, 2022.

# Implications and Recommendations.

Direct efforts to address chronic malnutrition or stunting as it affects 72,179 children.

With the significant increase of overweight (from 2.7% to 3.1%), actions have to be put in place to arrest the situation.

Prioritize areas with high prevalence in almost all indicators: Catmon \*3, Mabinay \*3, Guihulngan City \*2, San Jose \*2

# RULES AND FUNCTION OF BNS IN THE COMMUNITY



PD No. 1569 known as "Strengthening The Barangay Nutrition Program By Providing A Barangay Nutrition Scholar In Every Barangay".

Passed on June 11, 1978.

 Seeks to provide additional human resources for the implementation of programs, projects and activities.

Requiring at least one BNS per barangay.

• Aimed to address malnutrition.

# SECTION of PD ar6a defines a Parangay

#### SECTION 2 of P.D. 1569 defines a Barangay Nutrition Scholar

SECTION 2 of P.D. 1569 defines a Barangay Nutrition Scholar As follows:

"The barangay Nutrition Scholar shall be a barangay-based volunteer worker responsible for delivering nutrition services and other related activities such as community health, backyard food production, environmental sanitation, culture, mental feeding, and family planning to the barangay



#### •You deliver nutrition and related services to the community without salary. VOLUNTEER



•You have to continuously upgrade your knowledge and skills in order to perform community nutrition work.

### **ROLE OF BNS IN THE COMMUNITY**





• The BNS are involved in planning of programs, projects and activities that will be implemented in our respective barangay •Assist the Barangay Chairperson in organizing or reactivating the BNC

 Initiates and assist the BNC in the formulation of the barangay nutrition action plan

- BNS are responsible for coordinating with the BNC and C/MNAO / BNAO
- Coordinates meeting of the BNC and submits minutes of the meeting
  - **Facilitates nutrition related meetings**
  - Coordinates implementation of nutrition activities
- Refers clients to appropriate service providers

# As BNS, it is our responsibility to promotes and advocates nutrition program

- The BNS are the focal person in making sure that the planned activities are implemented
- Counsel mothers / father / caregivers of the children whose weight have decreased or whose children have not gained weight / height and also visit beneficiaries who fail to attend growth monitoring sessions.
- Counsel mother / fathers / caregivers to promote positive nutrition behaviors



monitors weight and height of all children o-59 months old together with the barangay health workers, under the supervision of the midwife.





 Provides basic nutrition and health information and acts as focal person in the referral of clients to services and in the promotion and advocacy of optimal infant and young child feeding practices.





- Refers sick and underweight children to health center, clinics or hospitals through the midwife.
- Refers eligible targets t of feeding program.
- Distributes or sells food as part of income generating projects
- Distributes available vitamins / mineral supplements

 Conducts or assists in conducting systematic nutrition and health education classics to mothers, especially the pregnant and lactating women.









 Promotes the construction, proper and continued use of sanitary toilet, giving priority to household with preschool children.

 Distributes available vegetable seeds and seedling to target families
