1. Upon receiving information on Typhoon *Karding*, all LGUs activated their Local Nutrition Clusters. Some activities reported were:
 - Coordination with members on the NIE activities to be conducted (All LGUs)
 - Coordination with Barangay Nutrition Clusters (Malabon, Las Pinas)
 - Monitoring of ECs (Navotas, Quezon City, Pasig, Marikina, Pasay)
 - Deployment of NDs/ BNSs (Navotas, Pasig)
 - Participation in the inter-cluster meetings (Valenzuela)
 - Prepositioning of supplies (Paranaque, Muntinlupa)

1. **Food Assistance:** Caloocan, Malabon, Valenzuela, Mandaluyong, Pasig, Taguig, Las Pinas, and Muntinlupa provided hot meals and or food packs to 5,398 evacuees (families, children, pregnant and lactating, elderly and PWDs).

2. **Micronutrient Supplementation:** 160 children were given Vitamin A in Caloocan and Muntinlupa; 14 children given with iron supplements in Muntinlupa; 27 children in Muntinlupa were given MNP

3. **Infant and Young Child Feeding:** All LGUs were very vigilant in monitoring milk formula donation in evacuation centers; Muntinlupa City posted 'No Milk Donation' tarpaulin and set up breastfeeding tent in all ECs; three (3) pregnant and lactating women were counseled on breastfeeding and proper complementary feeding in Mandaluyong and Muntinlupa; two (2) lactating mothers given breastfeeding kit in Taguig.

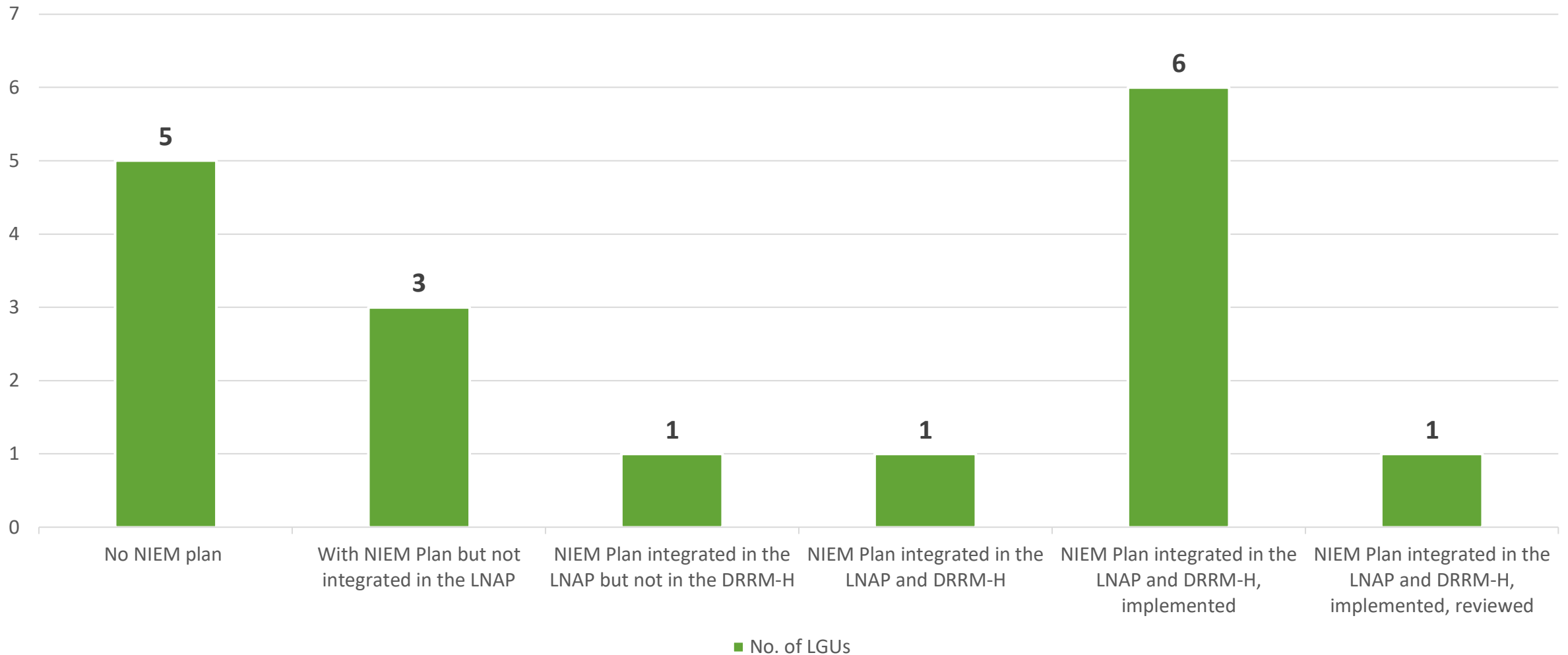

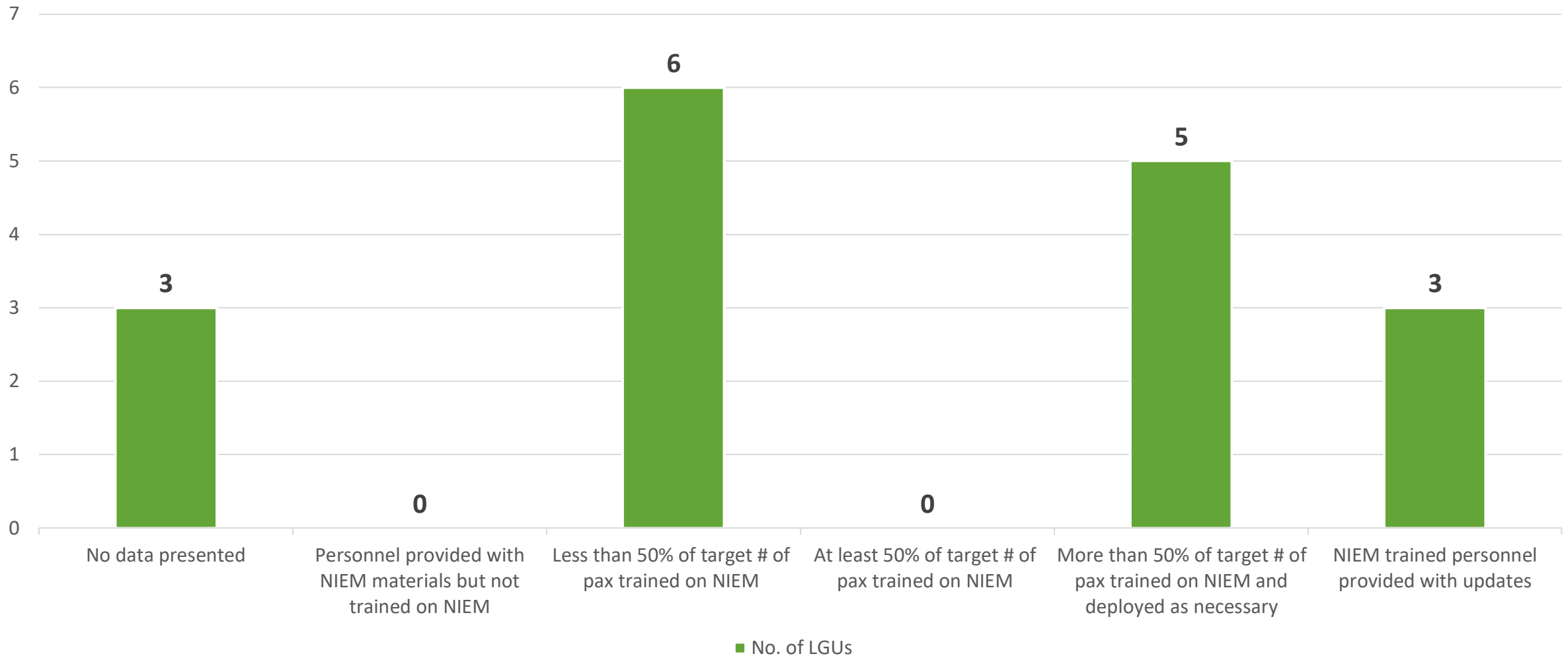
Results of 2022 MELLPI on Nutrition in Emergencies

AN ORDINANCE INTEGRATING THE NUTRITION IN EMERGENCIES IN THE MUNTINLUPA CITY DISASTER RISK REDUCTION MANAGEMENT PLAN 2017-2022.

WHEREAS, on June 19, 2017, the 8th Sangguniang Panlungsod approved Resolution No. 19-166, entitled, "A resolution ratifying the 2016 and adopting the 2017 Muntinlupa City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan;

WHEREAS, the Department of the Interior and Local Government Memorandum Circular No. 2018-42 dated March 26, 2018 stating, an adoption and implementation of the Philippine Plan of Action for Nutrition (PPAN) 201-2022 addressing the problems concerning the nutrition of the country;

WHEREAS, Muntinlupa City is identified by **Philippine Volcanologist and Seismologist (PHILVOCS)** as an area transected by the West Valley Fault System, which is predicted prone to severe ground rupture and ground shaking in the event of a major earthquake, that will compromise the safety and affect of lives of the population especially the most vulnerable groups such as: Infants, Children, pregnant women, persons with disabilities and the elderly, putting their Health and Nutrition status at risk;

WHEREAS, the Roles of Local Government Unit in the implementation, monitoring and evaluation of their respective local nutrition action plan and one of the major concerned is the Nutrition in Emergencies program which is not included in the Muntinlupa City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan for 2017-2022;

WHEREAS, the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management for Health (DRRM-H) which includes the Nutrition in Emergencies is very significant and crucial in Disaster response and must be included in the **Muntinlupa City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan for 2017-2022**;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, AS IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED, by 8th Sangguniang Panlungsod of Muntinlupa, to Integrate the Nutrition in Emergencies in the **Muntinlupa City Disaster Risk Reduction Management Plan 2017-2022**.

APPROVED, by 8th Sangguniang Panlungsod this 12th day of April, 2019, on its 18th Special Session.

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WHEREAS, Republic Act 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, empowers the Sangguniang Panlungsod to enact ordinances, approve resolutions and appropriate funds for the general welfare of the city and its inhabitants;

WHEREAS, Presidential Decree 491 of 1974 or the *Nutrition Act of the Philippines* created the *National Nutrition Council (NNC)* to supervise, coordinate and evaluate the implementation of the national nutrition program which shall be implemented by all agencies and instrumentalities of both the government and the private sector;

WHEREAS, on December 3, 2009, the NNC Governing Board approved Resolution No. 1 Series of 2009 Adopting a Policy on Nutrition Management in Emergencies and Disasters which shall apply to all sectors, whether government, non-government or private institutions whose functions and activities contribute to the prevention of a deterioration in the nutritional status of Filipinos particularly the most vulnerable groups: infants, children, pregnant women and breastfeeding mothers, older persons, people with disabilities, and people living with debilitating conditions during emergencies and disasters;

WHEREAS, the NCC Resolution will serve as guide of LGUs in preparing and managing the food and nutrition situation in times of emergencies and disasters at various stages: early, intermediate and extended emergency and shall set the directions on strategies for nutrition management in emergencies and disasters particularly on planning, surveillance, rapid nutritional assessment, and implementation of nutrition interventions at various stages;

ITS COMPOSITION AND FUNCTIONS,
AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

WHEREAS, the Philippines is located along the typhoon belt in the Pacific, and is visited by an average of twenty (20) typhoons every year, five (5) of which are painfully destructive;

WHEREAS, the Philippines, being situated in the "Pacific Ring of Fire," makes it vulnerable to frequent earthquakes and volcanic eruptions. Its geographical location and physical environment also contributes to its high-susceptibility to tsunamis, sea level rise, storm surges, landslides, floods, and drought;

WHEREAS, on 27 May 2010, the Republic Act No. 10121, otherwise known as the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (PDRRM) Act, provided for the adoption of a "disaster risk reduction and management approach that is holistic, comprehensive, integrated, and proactive in lessening the socio-economic and environmental impacts of disasters including climate change, and promote the involvement and participation of all sectors and all stakeholders concerned, at all levels, especially the local community;"

WHEREAS, the cluster approach, introduced as part of the humanitarian reform, aims at ensuring clear leadership, predictability and accountability in responses to humanitarian emergencies by clarifying the division of labor among organizations and better defining their roles and responsibilities within the different sectors involved in the response;

WHEREAS, the cluster approach was officially adopted by the Philippines in 2007, focuses on preparedness in normal times and responds to all emergencies when they occur;

WHEREAS, the Nutrition Cluster, under the Health Cluster, is spearheaded by the National Nutrition Council with the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) as co-lead agency, also provides technical support to Local Nutrition Committees who also serve as the Local Nutrition Clusters during emergencies;



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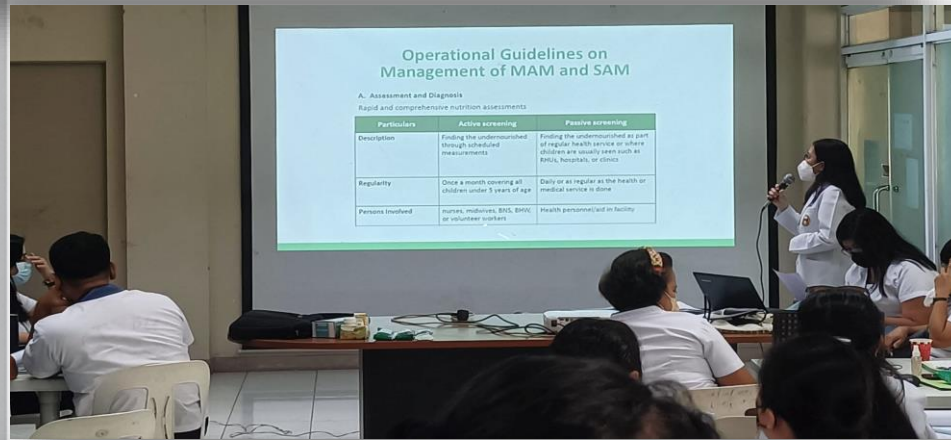
