- ▶ Conceptualized based on PD 1569
- ▶ Is a STRATEGY for the delivery of basic nutrition and health services through a trained community based volunteer known as Barangay Nutrition Scholar
- At least 1 BNS volunteer per barangay

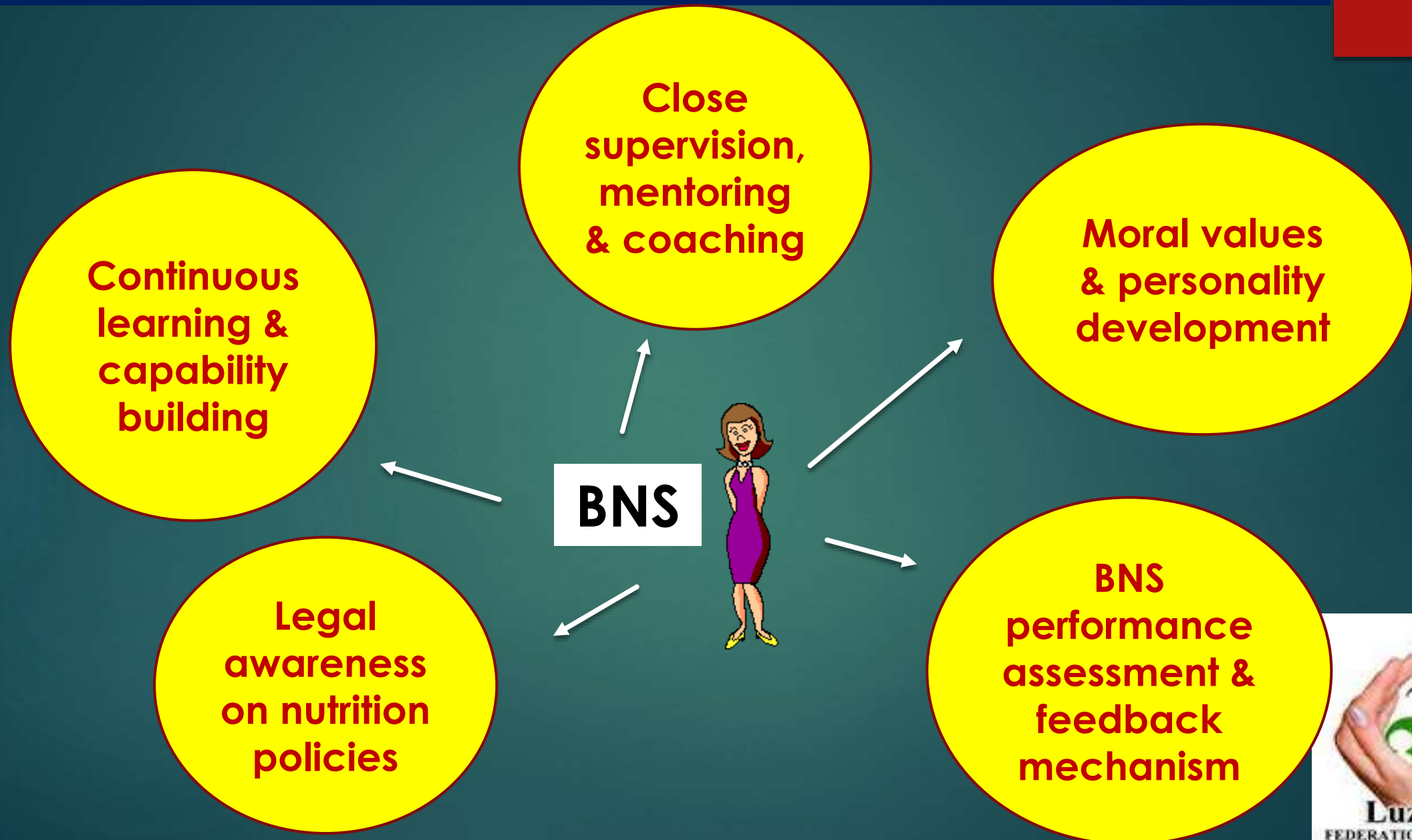

- ▶ D/CNPC- District/City Nutrition Program Coordinator
- ▶ P/C/MNAO – Provincial/City/Municipal Nutrition Action Officer
- ▶ RNPC – Regional Nutrition Program Coordinator



BNS Perspective Towards a D/CNPC

“L-I-S-T-O”

L – Leadership (mentoring, coaching, assisting)

I – Integrity (practice what you preach)

S – Supervise (close supervision)

T – Trust (trust and confidence)

O – Organized (with system)
